PLAYGROUND SAFETY...

It was brought to our attention before half term that a number of children are using the trim trails and the 'out of bounds' area of the field cordoned off by the orange plastic fencing after school. Please can we remind you that the trim trails and field are not supervised after school and therefore we discourage the children and younger siblings from using them after school in case of accidents. There have also been reports of children climbing on the wire fencing around our ball zone. Again, please can we ask parents to discourage children from doing this as a fall from the fencing could seriously injure a child and could encourage younger siblings to copy this unsafe practice. We don't want to spoil our children's fun, but equally the safety of our children on school premises is a major priority.

From September 2015 we will be reviewing our morning routine and procedures for attendance and punctuality and will share this information with parents in the new term. Attendance and punctuality will be a primary phase priority for next year and we would appreciate the support of our parents to get our children to school on time each day. ROAD SAFETY...



We really appreciate the support of our parents who avoided using the car park as a shortcut in the week before half term and used the pedestrian gate and path as a safer alternative.

We are still **very** concerned, however, at the way in which some of our parents drive to and from school, particularly along Clayburn Road and in the Leisure Centre car park. We cannot emphasise enough how important it is to drive within the 20mph speed limit along Clayburn Road and avoid becoming frustrated during the morning rush hour. Also **extreme care** should be taken driving into and out of the car park where many children and parents may be crossing the car park or the entrance. Please park in designated bays, rather than on the road or just inside the entrance. We know that the mornings are busy but again we are sure you will all agree that it is of paramount importance to ensure everyone arrives safe and sound at their destination, particularly our children.

Mr Jones and the primary phase Governors will be arranging a meeting with Peterborough City Council to discuss parking and traffic around the school this half term and we will feedback to you with any updates following the meeting. In the meantime, **please stay safe** and as the weather improves we would recommend walking to school where this is practical. Thank you all for your support with this.

Secondary phase siblings...

If your child is collected by their secondary phase sibling please can you emphasise the importance of them supervising their primary phase brother or sister on the way to or from school. Several parents have noticed older students walking way in front or behind their brothers and sisters and have expressed their concerns about our primary phase children not being supervised on their journey.
